1 Strategic Overview

7 Media Relations

The particular media will be communicated in the co-operation with the Press Office of the Ministry of Public Order and Citizen Protection and the press list for each communication activity will be prepared ad-hoc. Press book will contain all published articles and reference about this Programme and its projects.

8 Being on brand

To ensure the visibility and awareness of the available funding, the Programme Operator has already delivered the Communication and Design Manual published by FMO to all project promoters. The Communication and Design Manual provides guidance and advice on how to best carry out information and publicity activities for project promoters. The condition of the information and publicity requirements is stated in the particular project contracts. The basic objective of being on brand is immediate visual identification of recipient towards information messages. Information and publicity activities of the project promoters will be continuously monitored by Programme Operator and will be reported as the results in the Project Interim Reports

10 Indicative Budget

The Programme Operator has set aside an amount of money of the Programme management costs allocation for information and publicity measures.

- d) costs related to the equipment and hardware within information and publicity activities – notebooks, graphical software, digital camera, printer, etc.;
- e) Programme specific costs within information and publicity.

The evaluation of the information and publicity measures on the programme level will be carried out on the basis of the evaluation criteria according to the following indicators:

- ⇒ number of reports and articles in all types of media (national, regional and local);
- ⇒ visiting rate of the Programme webpage under the websites
- ⇒ number of seminars, conferences and other events carried out;
- ⇒ number of information publications;
- ⇒ other information and publicity activities carried out by the Programme Operator and project promoters during the monitoring period,
- ⇒ evaluation of specific Programme activities.
